MARCH 5, 2008**

**CALL TO ORDER:** Mayor Jones called the City Council/Redevelopment Agency Meeting to order at the hour of 7:00 p.m.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.** Police Commander Fitchie led the pledge of allegiance.

**CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF AGENDA:** City Manager Rath requested that item 11, Consideration of Approval of a Funding Augmentation in the amount of \$64,679.00 to Environmental Remediation Group for Additional Site Assessment Services and Testing as Required by the Merced County Office of Environmental Health for 740 Second Street (APN 025-054-007), City Council Resolution No. ~~4998~~ 4999 – Authorizing Funding Augmentation to Environmental Remediation Group for Site Assessment Services for the Redevelopment Agency be removed because it is still under legal review.

Motion by Faria, seconded by Brooks to approve the agenda as amended, with the removal of item 11, Consideration of Approval of a Funding Augmentation in the amount of \$64,679.00 to Environmental Remediation Group for Additional Site Assessment

Services and Testing as Required by the Merced County Office of Environmental Health for 740 Second Street (APN 025-054-007), City Council Resolution No. ~~4998~~ 4999 – Authorizing Funding Augmentation to Environmental Remediation Group for Site Assessment Services for the Redevelopment Agency. The motion carried by the affirmative action of all City Council/Redevelopment Agency Members present.

STEVE HAMMOND, Los Banos, would like to speak to item 12, Consideration of Adoption of Ordinance No. 1069 – Amending and Renumbering Title 2, Chapter 2, Article 1 Los Banos Area Parks and Recreation commission, Article 2 Los Banos Planning Commission, Article 3 Los Banos Youth Assistance Commission, Article 5 Los Banos Airport Advisory Commission, Article 6 Los Banos Cultural Heritage Commission; Amending the Selection/Appointment Process, Length of Terms/Term Limits, adding that he likes the ordinance for the most part but is in objection of making it a board of seven (7) members instead of five (5) because of the issue of interested applicants, the ability to get a quorum, costs associated with additional Planning Commissioners, i.e. sending them to conferences, and how there would be five (5) new commissioners with no experience and only two (2) with experience; NORM DONOVAN, Los Banos, spoke to item 12, Consideration of Adoption of Ordinance No. 1069 – Amending and Renumbering Title 2, Chapter 2, Article 1 Los Banos Area Parks and Recreation commission, Article 2 Los Banos Planning Commission, Article 3 Los Banos Youth Assistance Commission, Article 5 Los Banos Airport Advisory Commission, Article 6 Los Banos Cultural Heritage Commission; Amending the Section/Appointment Process, Length of Terms/Term Limits, stating that a Planning Commission of five (5) members runs more smoothly than a commission of seven (7), you can get more business done, and it is very difficult to get five (5) members to agree on something sometimes; JOHN SPEVAK, Los Banos, Member of the Los Banos Tree Committee and Parks & Recreation Commission, reminded all about the upcoming Arbor Day Celebration being held on March 7, 2008, spoke to the draft tree ordinance that the Parks & Recreation Commission is currently reviewing, and how he excited he is about the City planting 1000 trees; SANDY LEMAS, Los Banos, stated how happy she is that the recycling program has finally started, how the community recycling program will continue for one more month at the airport site with Kingsview taking over some of the recycling duties, free tax services at the WorkNet Office, and how businesses can benefit from the Enterprise Zone; RICK DAHLGREN, Los Banos, spoke regarding the California Senior Legislature and introduced Joe Cox as the Chairman of the Joints Rules Committee of the California Senior Legislature (CSL) who spoke explaining the purpose and the process of the CSL, how they deal with anything that affects seniors, March being declared “check off California Month” by Governor Schwarzenegger and encouraging all to check line 52 on their tax returns for the CSL fund, and thanked the City Council for all their support for seniors over the years; JOHN CALDERON, Los Banos, spoke regarding the proposed community center and asked the City Council make sure that

the Community Center also provide activities for young people; BEVERLY BROWN, Los Banos, would like to speak on item 8, Consideration of Approval of the Schematic Plans for the Los Banos Community Center, City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan, when it is presented; FRANCISCO VASQUEZ, Los Banos, spoke in support of a youth center being a part of the Community Center because there is a great need for the youth to have a place to go to get away from problems; KATHERINE EULEY, Los Banos, spoke to item 8, Consideration of Approval of the Schematic Plans for the Los Banos Community Center, City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan, and how she does not feel it is prudent to go forward with the Community Center at this time because of budget concerns and she feels that the proposed Community Center lacks a few essential needs and suggested that they table the item and revisit the idea and plans when we can fully build and staff the Community Center; MELVIN LITTLE, Los Banos, stated that we can't wait for the future, we need to think about the youth now not later, how the youth need something to do and we need to plan for the future; GB BLACKMON III, Los Banos, spoke regarding the SHOUT Arts Program and asked members of SHOUT to come forward and be recognized and they proceeded to sing a song; BILL MAYHEM, Los Banos, spoke to how Los Banos is growing and in support of the proposed Community Center, noting the need to preserve the cultural makeup of the City from the young to the old; MONICA ANDERSON, Los Banos, stated that she is torn with her feelings on the Community Center issue but spoke in support of the proposed Community Center and the need to not only address the young and old, but the 18-50 year olds too; LORI WILSON, Los Banos spoke in support of the proposed Community Center; ERICA DELACRUZ & ASHLEY MCELVANY, Los Banos, spoke regarding the upcoming Second Annual Fun Run being held on March 30, 2008 at Pacheco State Park with the proceeds to benefit the Dustin Hobbs and Gianni Caropreso Scholarship Funds and encouraged all to get involved; ASHLEY MCELVANY spoke regarding the "Ask Us" column in the Los Banos Enterprise that Mr. McNally's class has been writing and encouraged the public to ask the class a question and they will find the answer and put it in their column; CHUCK ARUDA, Los Banos, thanked the City Council for serving our community, spoke in support of the proposed Community Center, and to make sure that there is a component that includes the youth; ARMOND HENDERSON, Los Banos, spoke in support of the proposed Community Center and thanked the City Council for thinking about the children; DAVE ANDERSON, Los Banos, stated that he would like to speak to item 8, Consideration of Approval of the Schematic Plans for the Los Banos Community Center, City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan, after the presentation of the item is made; JOSE SANTANA, Los Banos, spoke in support of the proposed Community Center, looks forward to having a place where the kids can hang out and have somewhere to go and to lead them in the right direction; MIKE NEU, Los Banos, would also like to speak to item 8, Consideration of Approval of the Schematic Plans for the Los Banos Community Center, City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan, after the presentation is made. No one else came forward to speak and the public forum was closed.

**CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF THE SCHEMATIC PLANS FOR THE LOS BANOS COMMUNITY CENTER; CITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 4997 – APPROVING THE SCHEMATIC PLANS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE COMMUNITY CENTER AS OUTLINED IN BEVERLY PRIOR ARCHITECTS SCHEMATIC PLANS.** Public Works Director/City Engineer Chisam presented the staff report and turned the item over the Beverly Prior Architects to provide an overall plan, which Byron Johnson proceeded to do, which included a detailed PowerPoint presentation. Mary McGrath, Beverly Prior Architects, talked about the proposed Overall Project Budget for the proposed Community Center get, stating that it is estimated to cost \$12,500,000 to build Phase 1 and \$5,600,000 to build Phase 2, how they plan to award pre-construction to contractor in June 2008, award GNP contract to contractor in October 2008, start construction in March 2009, with the move in date to be June 2010.

The public was invited to come forward and speak on the item. A unidentified man spoke in opposition of the community center, speaking to the portable elements of the center, the basketball court without a hardwood floor, not sure basketball games should be going on at the same time and place as events in the grand room, the MOTT Foundation, would like to see a Fine Arts Program, and not being comfortable with the cost of the proposed Community Center; MIKE NEU, Los Banos, spoke in opposition of the proposed Community Center as presented because he feels that the fine arts programs should be addressed more than sports programs, and would like to see the gymnasium dropped as part of the proposed plan or drop the whole project; BEV BROWN, Los Banos, thanked staff for being able to review the proposed Community

Center plans and the opportunity for the community to give input, she spoke in support of the proposed Community Center plans before them tonight; DAVE ANDERSON, Los Banos, spoke in support of the proposed Community Center plans, his thoughts and ideas for putting in place a funding mechanism through the Redevelopment Agency to build Phase 2; SHIRLEY NAPOLITANO, Los Banos, spoke in support of the proposed Community Center plans and feels that we should just build it and move on, we will not be able to make everyone happy; No one else came forward to speak.

There was Council Member discussion regarding

Council Member Villalta stated that he would love to see a facility that addresses the needs of a community, what he sees before him he feels does not meet the needs of the community, not sure why these plans were changed after public input, feels that we should give all an opportunity to meet and make comments on the new revisions, not comfortable with the revised plans without input from the community, would like to have another Community Center Committee meeting before approving the plans at the meeting tonight, would like to see how much this will cost to staff and maintain, what the fixed costs are, what the fees are to rent this, he does not see community – he sees a gym and dining hall, and stressed that he wants to see a Community Center that reflects the whole community not just a few. Council Member Brooks stated that if we wait it will never happen, she knows that this plan is not perfect for everyone, noting that you will make 90% of the people happy 90% of the time, how hard it is to make everyone happy, how the City Council and staff have been working on this project for 2 ½ years, and reminding everyone that there has been plenty opportunities for public input. Mayor Jones asked Redevelopment manager Post to explain what the Redevelopment Agency funds can be spent on which she provided. Mayor Jones spoke in regards to his passion for the Community Center project, a way to create something for the kids to do to keep them out of trouble, a place for the seniors to utilize also, how it will never be perfect, you do the best you can possibly do for the complete community, we need to take care of the kids, he feels this is a great project, and we need to move forward with the plans. Council Member Sousa stated that this project has been around for more than 2 ½ years, how this is one of the most positive things that a City Council could do is build a Community Center, how we have always encouraged everyone to get involved throughout the process, how we need to do this now not later, this is a benefit to the community, the Community Center will be an integral part of the downtown corridor, and how he feels we need to move forward with the plans as presented tonight. Council Member Faria stated that the Community Center plans were shown to the public on February 21, 2008 and some changes were made and the updated plans have not had the opportunity to go back to the original committee to review and comment, he feels the kitchen is really too small, how courtyard could be shared with the grand room and gymnasium and possibly alcohol, does not feel the design matches the old down town Los Banos, performing arts ability is missing, need determine function to determine structure, how much and who will run the facility, how you fail to plan if you plan to fail, would like to table the issue to give the committee time to sign off on the revised plans and bring back in two weeks before we spend commit to spending \$12,000,000, creating a trigger mechanism in the Redevelopment Agency for fund the construction of Phase 2, and how he hates to see people divided by age.

Motion by Faria, seconded by Villalta to table item 8, Consideration of Approval of the Schematic Plans for the Los Banos Community Center, City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan so that the Community Center Committee can review the plans and bring it back in two weeks for City Council consideration. The motion failed by the following roll call vote: AYES: Faria, Villalta; NOES: Brooks, Sousa, Jones; ABSENT: None.

Motion by Sousa, seconded by Brooks to adopt City Council Resolution No. 4997 – Approving the Schematic Plans for the Construction of the Community Center as Outlined in Beverly Prior Architects Schematic Plan as identified in Attachment 2 – Schematic Floor Plans. The motion failed by the following roll call vote: AYES: Brooks, Sousa, Jones Brooks; NOES: Faria, Villalta; ABSENT: None.

**PUBLIC HEARING – TO DISCUSS THE FISCAL YEAR 2008-09 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM FOR THE GENERAL ALLOCATION AND TO SOLICIT CITIZEN INPUT.** Redevelopment Manager Post presented the staff report and asked Anna Fuentes from MCAG to give an overview of the CDBG Program, which she provided.

The public hearing was opened. No one came forward to speak and the public hearing was closed.

No action taken, just an opportunity for public input.

**CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF A FIVE YEAR LEASE OF TEN MEDIUM DUTY VEHICLES; CITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 4998 – AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A LEASE AGREEMENT APPROVED BY THE CITY ATTORNEY, AS TO FORM, WITH \_\_\_\_\_ FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF TEN (10) LEASED VEHICLES.** Public Works Director/City Engineer Chisam presented the staff report.

There was Council Member discussion regarding the lease price being down, the preferred course of action being to purchase the vehicles, liking the idea of owning the vehicles after five years, and Santos Ford being \$14,000 more than Hansel Ford.

Motion by Villalta, seconded by Faria to adopt City Council Resolution No. 4998 – Authorizing the City Manager to Enter into a Lease Agreement Approved by the City Attorney, as to Form, with Santos Ford for the Procurement of Ten (10) Leased Vehicles. The motion carried by the following vote: AYES: Brooks, Faria, Villalta, Jones; NOES: Sousa; ABSENT: None.

**CONSIDERATION OF THE ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 1069 – AMENDING AND RENUMBERING TITLE 2, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 1 LOS BANOS AREA PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION, ARTICLE 2 LOS BANOS PLANNING COMMISSION, ARTICLE 3 LOS BANOS YOUTH ASSISTANCE COMMISSION, ARTICLE 5 LOS BANOS AIRPORT ADVISORY COMMISSION, ARTICLE 6 LOS BANOS CULTURAL HERITAGE COMMISSION; AMENDING THE SELECTION/APPOINTMENT PROCESS, LENGTH OF TERMS/TERM LIMITS. (Second Reading & Adoption)** City Attorney Vaughn presented the staff report, noting the change to increase the membership of the Planning Commission from 5 members to 7 members.

Mayor Jones invited the public to speak. NORM DONOVAN, Los Banos, spoke in opposition of increasing the Planning Commission to 7 members instead of keeping it at 5 members. He feels that a 5 member Planning Commission is more efficient.

Council Member Brooks stated that she would like to see the number on the Planning Commissioners stay at 5. Council Member Sousa says that he understands their concerns but feels that adding two members would provide for the opportunity of more involvement from the community.

Motion by Villalta, seconded by Sousa to waive the second reading of Ordinance No. 1069 – Amending and Renumbering Title 2, Chapter 2, Article 1 Los Banos Area parks and Recreation Commission, Article 2 Los Banos Planning Commission, Article 3 Los Banos Youth Assistance Commission, Article 5 Los Banos Airport Advisory Commission, Article 6 Los Banos Cultural Heritage Commission; Amending the Selection/Appointment process, Length of Terms/Term Limits. The motion carried by the following vote: AYES: Faria, Sousa, Villalta, Jones; NOES: Brooks; ABSENT: None.

Motion by Villalta, seconded by Sousa to adopt Ordinance No. 1069 – Amending and Renumbering Title 2, Chapter 2, Article 1 Los Banos Area parks and Recreation Commission, Article 2 Los Banos Planning Commission, Article 3 Los Banos Youth Assistance Commission, Article 5 Los Banos Airport Advisory Commission, Article 6 Los Banos Cultural Heritage Commission; Amending the Selection/Appointment process, Length of Terms/Term Limits. **2008 SPRING CLEANUP DAY. (INFORMATIONAL ITEM ONLY)** Public Works Operations Manager Pimentel spoke to the upcoming 2008 Spring Clean Up Day being held on April 12, 2008, the new recycling program and the commercial that will be produced by City staff to begin airing on Channel 96 tomorrow, how backyard garbage pickup service will be available to those who have a disability with a note from the doctor and how senior citizens 65 years old and older can also get backyard service,

this will be the first clean up day that will involve recycling, and displayed the new grebe recycling bags being distributed at City Hall.

There was Council Member discussion regarding what types of waste is recyclable and what it not, and inquired as to the status of implementing the assistance plan for those who can not afford the added costs.

**REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY UPDATE.** Redevelopment Manager Post spoke regarding the 2007 HOME Investment Partnership Program, the First Time Homebuyers Program, the next Economic Development Advisory Committee Meeting on March 10, 2008, the next Street Naming Committee on March 17, 2008, the new city banners will be going up soon downtown, and a presentation on the new Merced County Enterprise Zone by Congressman Cardoza.

**ADVISEMENT OF PUBLIC NOTICES (ONE REPORT)** Public Works Director/City Engineer Chisam reported that a Public Hearing will be held at the Planning Commission Meeting on March 12, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. to consider an amendment to the Los Banos Municipal Code regarding mobile vendors. The Ordinance amendment request would apply City-wide.

**CITY MANAGER/EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT.** City Manager Rath stated that representatives from May Day Fair have requested a meeting to discuss sponsorship of the event and he is looking for two Council Members to meet with the fair people, and Council Members Faria and Sousa stated that they would like to be at that meeting.

### **CITY COUNCIL / REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY MEMBER REPORTS.**

**TOM FARIA:** Spoke regarding how his father has recently become ill, the upcoming Arbor Day Event being held on March 7, 2008 and comments he has received from the public regarding unsavory individuals tormenting walkers on the rail trail and the need to make them feel safe. He requested that a committee be created to start looking into the staffing needs, program activities and financing mechanisms for the Community Center and he would also like to discuss implementing a trigger for Redevelopment Agency funding for Phase 2 of the Community Center. He stated that he feels it would be wise to adopt the updated General Plan before approving future annexations.

**JOE SOUSA:** Stated that his prayers are with Council Member Faria's father, Spoke regarding the upcoming Arbor Day event on March 7, 2008 at Orchard Park, how the Child Development Center is now open with an open house scheduled in the future, his recent trip to Washington, D.C. to speak to delegates regarding transportation appropriation issues and thanked Congressman Cardoza for his support and time, and the cartoon in the local newspaper last week and his feelings on annexations.

**MIKE VILLALTA:** Spoke regarding the photo show being held at the Ted Falasco Arts Center, the Rotary Crab Feed on April 4, 2008, how the Council Members we all have different opinions and his comments are his comments, encouraged the public to contact him if they have feedback for him, how happy he is that we will have a

Community Center but would still like to see a staffing and budget plan for once its open, wanting to see the updated General Plan adopted before we annex any new land, his recent trip to Washington, D.C. to speak to delegates regarding transportation appropriation issues and thanked Congressman Cardoza for all his efforts and how very important it is that we continue to receive funds for the Los Banos Bypass we very much need with the gridlock on the highway, and reminded all about the Arbor Day event on March 7, 2008.

**ANNA BROOKS:** Spoke regarding the Foreclosure Workshop presented by Assemblywomen Calgiani and Congressman Cardoza and how glad she was that we were reaching out to help those in need, thanked Council Members Villalta and Sousa and staff for going to Washington, D.C. to speak to delegates regarding transportation appropriation issue, and reminded all that day light savings time begins on Sunday, March 9, 2008.
